Celebrating Success

Teresa's Story



Teresa, a New York native and the oldest of four girls, joined the military at 17 and served as an aircraft electrician and medical administrator. As a young mother, Teresa saw the military as an opportunity to gain independence and dedicated 8 years to her service. Following her time in the military, she relocated to Charlotte to be closer to her family.

After a series of devastating personal setbacks that included her father's terminal illness and eventual passing, she sought mental health treatment because, as she says, "I wanted to save my life." When she completed her treatment, she moved into our shelter.

Reflecting on her decision to seek shelter at Rowan Helping Ministries, Teresa says, "It was a relief because I had my own space and I didn't have to depend on family or friends to help me because I wanted to get to a place of independence – it could help the process of me getting to where I wanted to be." Determined to change the course of her life, Teresa accessed resources from our valued partners at the Salisbury VA Medical Center to seek employment and stable housing. She spent six transformative months in our shelter, working hard to reach her goals.

"Being here at the shelter, I appreciated everything about it", Teresa says. Her gratitude fueled her desire to return and be an inspiration to others. Currently in her final semester of a social work degree at Livingstone College, Teresa is fulfilling her required fieldwork at Rowan Helping Ministries. She is also involved in Project LIGHT, an organization that combats human trafficking, and is looking forward to continuing to volunteer and be of service to others. Teresa says, "I wanted to come back here and hope to be an encouragement – if you can touch one person, you've done a lot."

Offering words of encouragement to anyone on their pathway to changing their life, she says, "Don't be discouraged, this is a stepping stone to a better life, this is not the end all - this is the beginning of the process of picking your life back up!" We are so grateful to Teresa for sharing her time, knowledge, and wisdom with our guests and clients. As

she approaches the culmination of her social work degree, we are excited to witness the remarkable journey that lies ahead of her.

Eagle's Nest III Move-In









January 24th was our long-anticipated Eagle's Nest III move-in day for Veterans in our VA GPD program as well as some of our staff! The first group of Veterans, including Khris and Clay, moved their belongings across the street and began to make themselves at home in the bright and spacious new apartments. Rowan Helping Ministries staff members Sherry Smith and Solomon Tafari also took up residence in their renovated office space in the historic R.B. Miller building. Eagle's Nest III is made up of 12 transitional apartments, 9 of which are reserved for Veterans, and its opening brings the total number of transitional units on our campus to 22. We thank our generous donors and partners for helping us make this vision a reality and we wish our residents the best as they work to find their pathways home.

Our guests enjoyed the delicious lasagna and pancakes prepared by the Daughters, and we are grateful for their continued support and service. Thank you, Catholic Daughters!





Ava and Maisie Whisenant are sisters who have donated their proceeds from their crafting stations and lemonade stand to Rowan Helping Ministries since 2019. We nominated them for the Service Above Self Youth Award, and they were honored this year for their outstanding volunteer work. The Service Above Self Youth Awards is a yearly event honoring youth in Rowan County who go above and beyond in their communities and in their schools. The dedication and caring demonstrated by these young women means the world to us and makes such a difference in the lives of those we serve!



With nowhere to stay except the streets, homeless individuals have a high risk of hypothermia, frostbite, and even death in freezing weather. When temperatures drop below 20 degrees, we open the doors to Jeannie's Kitchen from 8 p.m. to 8 a.m. to unsheltered homeless community members seeking refuge from the cold. Volunteers provide those seeking shelter from extreme temperatures with blankets, hot beverages and snacks, and warm clothing, as well as comfort and a sense of community. We are deeply grateful for the many volunteers who came out late at night in frigid temperatures to make sure some of our most vulnerable citizens were safe.

RCCC Employability Lab

Since 2017, R3 Services has operated the RCCC Employability Lab & Computer Skills Classes at Rowan Helping Ministries. The Lab meets two times each week, both

virtually and in person. Instructors offer one-on-one assistance with job searches, resume writing, completing onboarding paperwork, and any other employment needs, as well training on Microsoft Word, Excel, and other computer programs to groups of 10-15 guests. The Employability Lab also assists guests with enrolling in RCCC classes. RCCC has offered scholarships to our guests for such classes and degree programs as Forklift Certification, Truck Driving, Pharmacy Tech, Medical Coding, EMS Services, Certified Logistics Technician, Real Estate Certification, Small Engine Repair, and computer skills and certifications. They also enroll guests in the North Carolina Manufacturing Institute, provides technical skills training and education for those seeking higher-paying jobs in the manufacturing industry. The Employability Lab is made possible by a partnership between RCCC, Goodwill Career Connections, and NCWorks. This invaluable partnership has allowed so many of our guest to achieve their goals and become self-sufficient.





Will Run for Food 5K




