# Celebrating Success

Jesse's story is one of resilience, hope, and redemption. Born and raised in Woodleaf, North Carolina, Jesse's life was plagued with drug addiction and dealing from a young age. First introduced to the world of drugs at just 11 years old, he spent much of his preteen and adult years using and selling drugs.

It wasn't until Jesse hit rock bottom that he finally decided to seek help at Sober Living America, a treatment center that specializes in helping people overcome their addictions. Although it was a challenging journey, Jesse was able to overcome his addiction and start rebuilding his life, refusing to give up and always picking himself up.


Despite making progress, Jesse found himself back on the streets, using and selling drugs once again. This led to his return to jail, but this time something was different. During his sentence, he found God and his life took a turn for the better. "I think God placed me in that prison to save me," Jesse said.

After his release, Jesse headed to Salisbury, where he initially stayed with a family member before finding his way to Rowan Helping Ministries. His newfound faith gave him the motivation he needed to get his life back on track. He was determined to stay clean and focused on sharing the gospel with others who were struggling with addiction, just as he had.

During his time at the Robertson-Stanback Center, Jesse worked closely with his case manager, participated in New Tomorrow's classes, and even found a job. His hard work paid off, and he saved \$400, to move into his apartment. With the help of Rowan Helping Ministries' Crisis Assistance Network, Jesse was able to move into his new place.


Currently, Jesse is working alongside Goodwill Career Connections to enroll in school to become a certified counselor and peer support specialist.
